⁸ **Graduates Unavailable for Employment**

The graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

⁹ **Graduates Employed in the Field**

Graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six-month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

¹⁰ Placement Rate Employed in the Field

Calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

¹¹ Salary

As reported by the graduate or graduate's employer.

¹² No Salary Information Reported

The number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

¹³ Number of Graduates Taking Exam

The number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year - not applicable for GA.

¹⁴ First Available Exam Date

The date for the first available exam after a student completed a program - not applicable for GA.

¹⁵ Passage Rate

The rate calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam - not applicable for GA.

¹⁶ Number Who Passed First Available Exam

The number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program - not applicable for GA.

Student's Right to Cancel

1. Cancellation occurs when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the address of attendance stated on the enrollment agreement. This can be done by email or by hand delivery. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
2. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
3. You have the right to cancel your course of instruction, without any penalty or obligation, through attendance at the first-class session (the Course Start Date on p. 1 of Enrollment Agreement) or seven days after enrollment (the execution date of Enrollment Agreement), whichever comes later.
4. If the Enrollment Agreement is canceled, the school will refund any money he/she paid, less the registration and course materials received by the student within 30 days after the notice of cancellation is received.
